## Hola...Salut...

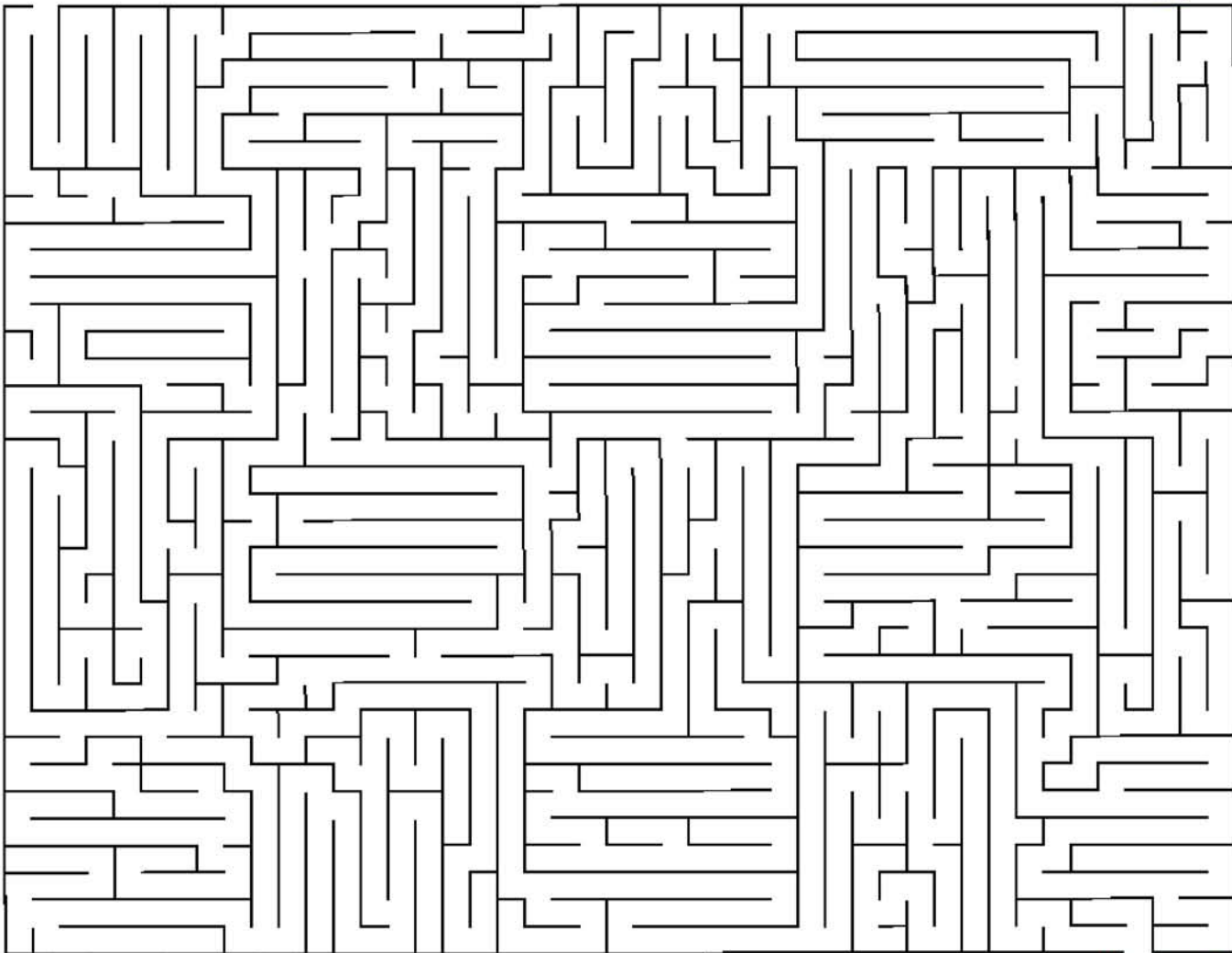

In Moldova "thank you" is "multumesc."  
You say it "moult-su-mesk." In Cambodia  
the kids say "awkhoun charan" and in  
Spanish you say "gracias."



This is how to say "Hello" in some different languages:

In Hindi (spoken in India) say "namasthai"

In French (which is spoken in the D.R. Congo) say "bonjour"

In Romanian say "salut"

In Spanish you would say "hola"

In Cambodian try saying "jum rip sua"

Try all these greetings out on your family and friends and see if they know what you're saying!
